As we approach the summer season, I would like to take a moment to connect with you and reflect on the incredible progress and growth we've experienced together over the past four years. Strong fiscal responsibility has been central to our decisions. Effective this year, although there is a slight decrease in the municipal mill rate, the Municipal Services Tax will increase from \$1,000 to \$1,050 per property. This modest adjustment ensure we can continue to provide essential services, such as Assessment Services, Fire Services, Patrol Services, RCMP, Street Lights, Sewer Commission, and Water Commission.

In addition, the provincial education property tax rates for the 2025–26 fiscal year have increased by approximately 8%. When combined with the municipal services tax change, this may lead to a higher overall property tax bill for some residents. The total impact will depend on individual property assessments.

We encourage all residents to review their 2025 Property Tax Statement and Assessment Notices. These updates are made with careful consideration to support infrastructure projects, enhance public safety, and ensure the continued well-being of our community. Alberta Beach continues to be a hub of activity thanks to your enthusiasm and participation in local events. TAXATION & ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

2025 Tax & Assessment Notices

The Combined Tax and Assessment Notices are mailed on June 10th. Taxes are **due by August 9th annually**. An 18% penalty is applied to the unpaid current years' taxes on August 10th. An 18% penalty is also applied to all outstanding taxes owing on January 1st of each year.

Failure to receive a tax assessment notice is not considered sufficient reason for non-payment of taxes. Late payment penalties will be applied.

Monthly Tax Payment Plan

Notice of Assessment Complaint Procedure

1. Right to Information

You can view your property assessment details at the Village Office, by phone, or on our website.

2. Speak with the Assessor

Before filing a complaint, contact Assessor Travis Horne (780-939-3310) to discuss any potential assessment adjustments.

3. Filing a Complaint

- **Deadline: Monday, August 18th, 2025**
- **Fees:** \$50 (residential/farmland) | \$150 (non-residential)
- Submit a written complaint using the prescribed form (available at the Village Office or online).
Refund: If the complaint is successful or withdrawn before the hearing, the fee is refundable.

4. Property Taxes

Property taxes must be paid on time, even if a complaint is filed. Refunds will be processed after an adjustment.

5. How to File:

- Submit the complaint form and fee by mail or in person at the Alberta Beach Village Office.

Failure to receive a tax notice due to an incorrect mailing address **does not** exempt you from payment of property taxes. Penalties will apply to all overdue taxes.

Before starting any development or demolition in Alberta Beach, you must first get a **Development Permit** (Bylaw 252-17). Once approved, Safety Codes permits maybe required for, building, gas, plumbing, and electrical.

ASCA Permit Application - Paperless Processing Now in Effect

As of April 1, 2024, the Alberta Safety Codes Authority (ASCA) has transitioned to paperless permit application processing. This change is aimed at enhancing efficiency, streamlining service delivery, and supporting environmental sustainability.

What's Changing?

Email addresses for both the owner and the applicant are now mandatory on all permit applications. This requirement enables seamless digital communication and document handling.

Helmet Requirements for Off-Highway Vehicle Riders



Legislation requires off-highway vehicle riders to wear helmets when driving, operating, riding in or being towed by an OHV. TRAFFIC SAFETY ACT 128.1(3)(c) & 119(2)(a-b).

Do Not Leave Animals Unattended in Vehicles

Leaving pets in vehicles, especially in warm weather, can be dangerous or fatal.

Fines will apply.

Untidy & Unightly Bylaw 286-21

Alberta Beach will be enforcing clean-up of untidy and unsightly properties, including uncut grass.

If the Village must perform cleanup, costs will be added to your tax roll.

- Grass (including ditches) is mowed.
- Noxious weeds are destroyed
- Derelict vehicles, appliances, and scrap materials are removed.

The Alberta RCMP has a province-wide online crime reporting website that provides residents the ability to report the following property crimes in a convenient and accessible way:

- Damage/mischief to property under \$5,000
- Theft of bicycle under \$5,000
- Theft under \$5,000
- Theft from vehicle under \$5,000
- Lost property

To be reported online, incidents must also meet the following conditions:

- No witnesses or suspects
- Item(s) lost or stolen must cost less than \$5,000
- Vandalized property will cost less than \$5,000 to repair
- There are no items involving personal identity, firearms, licence plates or decals

By reporting these less-urgent crimes online, emergency call takers and members of the RCMP can focus their time and prioritize calls. K Division's Call Back Unit will follow up on all crimes reported online within five business days.

Only burn seasoned wood, paper/cardboard, or dry vegetation. Fires must be in a pit or enclosure no larger than 3 feet wide.</p> <p>Extinguishing Your Fire – Remember: “Soak It. Stir It. Soak It Again.” Let the fire burn down before extinguishing, spread the embers within the fire pit, add water or loose dirt and stir thoroughly, expose any remaining burning material, add more water and stir again until no smoke or steam is visible.</p> <p>Never leave a fire unattended.</p> <p>Follow all safety rules. NEW—Permanent Electors Register

With the passing of the *Municipal Affairs Statutes Amendment Act, 2024 (Bill 20)*, all municipalities are now required to maintain a Permanent Electors Register — a list of residents eligible to vote in municipal elections. To support this, municipalities will receive updated elector information directly from Elections Alberta.

Please note: you must be registered in order to vote on Election Day.

To ensure your information is current and accurate, visit voterlink.ca to register or update your voter details — including for other eligible electors in your household.

 The information collected for the Electors Register is used exclusively for election purposes.

MAKE SURE YOUR WASTE & ORGANICS ARE COLLECTED:

Garbage (Grey Bin):

To ensure your garbage is picked up on collection day, use the following tips:

- ensure your bin is out for collection by 7:00 a.m. on collection day.
- ensure your garbage bin is in the correct location and has at least **1 metre** of clearance on all sides as well as above the cart from any obstacle including parked vehicles, fences, or other carts etc, so as to allow direct and unimpeded access of the collection truck arm directly without hinderance of any kind.
- ensure your bin is free of ice and snow during the winter months.
- place your bin wheels to the curb edge of the roadway or lane (handles facing towards your home).
- all household garbage waste must be bagged and inside the (Grey) bin with the lid fully closed, overflowing carts will not be collected.

Organics (Dark Bin):

To ensure your organics is picked up on collection day, use the following tips:



- ensure your bin is out for collection by 7:00 a.m. on collection day.
- ensure your organic bin is in the correct location and has at least **1 metre** of clearance on all sides as well as above the cart from any obstacle including Parked vehicles, fences, or other carts etc, so as to allow direct and unimpeded access of the collection truck arm directly without hindrance of any kind.
- place your bin wheels to the curb edge of the roadway or lane (handles facing to wards your home).
- all organic yard waste **must be unbagged** in the bin with the lid fully closed, over flowing carts will not be collected.

Acceptable Organics – Grass, leaves, pruning's, garden trimmings, small wood pieces. **Organic carts with items other than grass trimmings, leaves, and branches WILL NOT be picked up.**

If garbage or other non-organic waste is placed in your organics bin this will contaminate the load which will then have to be diverted to the landfill site resulting in additional disposal fees. Non-compliance may result in the issuance of a bylaw fine.

For large items and excessive waste, refuse can be brought to the Regional Landfill site operated by the Highway 43 East Waste Commission Monday – Saturday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm located on Highway 43 and RR35. (3 miles west of Gunn on Hwy 43, then ¼ mile south on RR 35). Family & Community Support Services (FCSS)



Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) is a unique funding partnership between the Government of Alberta and participating municipalities or Métis Settlements. The program operates on an 80/20 cost-sharing model, with the province covering 80% of eligible costs and municipalities or Métis Settlements contributing the remaining 20%. FCSS receives its mandate from the *Family and Community Support Services Act and Regulation*. The Act outlines the roles and responsibilities of both the provincial government and local authorities in delivering preventive social services. The Regulation provides guidance on how these services can be implemented. Under the FCSS program, each community has the flexibility to design and deliver programs that are preventive in nature, aimed at enhancing the well-being of individuals, families, and communities.





Do not flush ,

Helping us by doing your part, helps preserve the environment and our sewer system

Alberta Beach Sewer Bylaw 231-10

It is **prohibited** to discharge any of the following into the **sanitary sewer system**:

- Storm water (including runoff from eavestroughs and sump pumps), Grease, oil, dangerous substances, or other pollutants. **Violations may result in fines up to \$2,500** plus the cost of repairs.

Help protect our sewer system—**follow the bylaw.**

Tri-Village Regional Sewer Services Commission (TVRSSC)

Policy Statement: Do not discharge fat, grease, coffee grounds, ashes, animal parts, shredded cabbage, or any solid/viscous substances into the sanitary sewer system. These can cause serious blockages. Help keep the sewer system flowing—dispose responsibly.

Property owners are responsible for:

- Clearing blockages from the building to the sewer main
- Hiring an approved sewer cleaning service
- Covering all associated costs

Policy — Clean-Out Line Requirement:

- All new sewer line installations must include a clean-out line from the main connection to ground level.
- The clean-out must be securely capped and protected from damage.

Existing properties with service lines over 100 feet may be required to install a clean-out if a blockage or connection issue is reported.

Procedure:

If the blockage is on municipal property, the Maintenance Manager will determine the need to install a clean-out at the property line, arrange excavation and supervise the installation of the clean-out line.

Policy: Sanitary Sewer Line Blockages & Separations:

- All blockages must be reported to the Maintenance Manager or their designee.
- Property owners are responsible for ensuring that only approved liquid waste enters the Tri-Village sanitary sewer system.

Property owners are responsible for:

- Clearing blockages from the building to the property line, and from the property line to the main
- Hiring an approved sewer cleaning service
- Covering all related costs, including blockages caused by prohibited substances or tree roots from private property

If the Tri-Village Regional Sewage Services Commission incurs any costs, these may be charged back to the owner and collected as taxes owing. The Maintenance Manager has final discretion on how blockages are handled.

Sanitary Sewer Blockage Procedure:

- Report the blockage to the Maintenance Manager or designee.
- An approved sewer cleaning service must snake the line and provide a written report to the Maintenance Manager.
- If the blockage is on private property, the homeowner must arrange and pay for excavation and repairs.

If the blockage is on municipal property, the Maintenance Manager will:

- Assess the need for a clean-out at the property line
- Arrange excavation and supervise installation
- The line will be snaked from the clean-out to the main. If frozen, it will be steamed by an approved provider before any road excavation.

The SVREMP is a collaborative initiative formed by member municipalities to fulfill legislative requirements for unified emergency management planning and delivery. Officially established in 2017 through a ministerial order, SVREMP is committed to fostering effective emergency management practices aligned with provincial mandates and in close coordination with regional partners.

Organizational Structure

SVREMP operates under a bicameral organizational structure, consisting of:

Advisory Committee

- Comprised of one elected representative from each member municipality.
- Responsible for reviewing and approving recommendations from the Management Committee.
- Elects a Chair and Vice Chair from among its members.

Management Committee

- Composed of each municipality's Director of Emergency Management (DEM) and Deputy Director of Emergency Management (DDEM).
- Serves as the administrative and operational branch, responsible for planning and execution.
- Designates a Regional DEM and Deputy Regional DEM(s), who provide executive leadership within the committee.

The Advisory Committee provides strategic direction, which is implemented by the Management Committee through coordinated efforts across member municipalities.
